Capital Campaign Update/Challenge

We are one year into our campaign for capital improvements to the church building, and some of the work has already been completed while other work is still in progress.

Here's what's happened so far:

- The upper roof of the Bell Tower has been sealed with new plastic cement to stop the leaking which has caused damage on the walls and ceiling on the stairs leading up to the youth room.
- The Saddle/Cricket wall has been resealed at all the saddle wall flashings.
- The Christian Education Wing had existing parapet wall cap flashing on the east and north exterior wall perimeters removed and new 24 gauge

Kynar cleat metal installed which anchors the new 24 gauge Kynar pre-painted metal cap flashing in place. If you

didn't understand all that, don't worry, neither did I! Just know that this work will stop the leaking along the interior wall of the large group area.

Here's the exterior work which is still to be completed:

• Tuck-pointing of CE Wing Ma-

sonry

- Tuck-pointing of Stone Masonry on Bell Tower
- Exterior Caulking of Aluminum frame windows and door openings
- Resealing of Vertical Control Joints
- Exterior Caulking of all movement and structural cracks in the stone masonry and CE Wing masonry.

The following work will transform the Men's Bathroom into an ADA compliant Family Bathroom:

- Flooring: remove existing tile and replace
- Plumbing: remove existing toilet, sink and water fountain. Replace with ADA compliant.
- Remove partitions and hardware.
 - Replace door with wider door for easier wheelchair access.

• Update ceiling, drywall, paint and electrical as needed.

All of this work is being made possible through

your generosity, and the good news is that we have made great progress toward our goal of \$100,000 by the end of the year 2021!

Here are the specifics as of January 31, 2020:

Amount received \$36,488.24 (including starting balance of \$2,505).

Amount pledged not yet received \$17,600; Amount remaining (not including pledges) \$63,511.76.

In order to **help nudge us forward** toward our goal, we have set a goal to take all the envelopes off of the "Money Wall" by the end of this year, 2020. That means that about \$1,500 each month beyond our pledges will be needed to clean off the wall.

Here's how it works. Each envelope has now been given a sticker which corresponds to one of the remaining months of 2020. When you are ready to give, pull off one of the envelopes from the current month, and we will begin to see progress as the envelopes disappear!

Let's be creative and work together as the team that God has called us to be, and get this done!

March Prayer Focus: Are we there yet?

In February we focused on pressing on to know the LORD. As I prayed through the **31 Personal Prayers from Colossians**** the thought "Are we there yet?" has popped into my head. Which is, of course, rather silly – of course we aren't. The more we know the LORD, the more there is to know. That's what pressing on is all about!

So let's keep going!

Let us never be satisfied with just knowing ABOUT Jesus. We need to KNOW Him. To be in close relationship. To share in His priorities and make them ours. To take on His character. To love more and forgive more because He loves and forgives us.

All the intellectual understandings of theology and Biblical facts are empty without the closeness of His indwelling Spirit. This is eternal life knowing God the Father and Jesus Christ whom He sent. Knowing Christ strengthens our faith (Colossians 1:10-11), reveals the riches of His glory (1:27) and promotes our growth in holiness (1:28). Pressing on to know the LORD encourages us (2:2) and keeps us from getting side-tracked. It helps us "keep the main

thing, the main thing" (2:4).

Without knowing God we risk getting caught up in the unfulfilling worldviews, philosophies and temptations that surround

us (2:8). We risk the legalism that flows out of scriptural knowledge isolated from a Spirit-softened heart (2:16-17).

Even worship of God can lure us into spiritual pride and selfrighteousness unless we know the God we worship (2:18-23). A believing heart filled with a growing understanding of who Christ is necessary for Godexalting worship. If we want to be those who worship Him in Spirit and in Truth, we must press on to know Him (3:16-17)

How do we press on to know God? We know how – prayer, meditating on and memorizing scripture, applying God's truth to our lives. Walking in obedience. It's more a matter of do-

> ing what we know. Taking time, MAK-ING time. Making knowing God a priority.

We are blessed to live in a time and place where we have ready access to His Word.

And we share with all believers the

assurance that everyone who seeks, finds; everyone who asks, receives; when we knock, the door will be open. He wants us to know Him!

Let us press on to know the LORD.



Changes at GIFTS Men's Shelter by Beau Gilmore

There were two major announcements from the GIFTS Ministry in the last few weeks.

The first was the resignation of Stephanie Burton the executive director. Stephanie has decided to move to northern Minnesota to be near her family. Her last day at GIFTS will be March 31st. Stephanie has taken GIFTS from being a 8 month overnight shelter to the fulltime use building that we are now in. Her 7-8 years of service will be missed. She takes our prayers and thanks with her. The second announcement is the startup of a thrift store towards the end of



summer. I know that that is something that has been researched and planned for the past 18 months. It will be led by Dave Ellis. The site of the store is the west end of the Black Bridge Bowl building. It is my understanding that many shelters around the country have something similar to what this will be. This does provide many options for the ministry – a place for the many donations that have come in and something for men to do during the day.

As God works with the ministry, his timing has always been right for new steps that help us improve. Our next week of serving the ministry will be the week of Oct. 4th, we will have Mon., Tues., Wed., and Thurs. Due to scheduling issues we will not be serving this spring.

It is through God's grace and prayers that the ministry continues to improve and prosper. I ask for your continued prayers for the ministry, Stephanie, and the new store.

A Place for You by Staff at Pray4Rohingya.org

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." (John 14:1-3)

Sitting in Ahmed's home we enjoy remarkable Rohingya hospitality, being served the usual sweet energy drink, a small serving of noodles and, today's special, a Burmese tealeaf salad. His home is amongst the sprawling lanes of bamboo huts with tarpaulin roofs that make up the refugee camp in Bangladesh. It is hot, sticky and loud, but Ahmed can live here without fear; he knows that his family is safe from attack. For now, it is his home.

In the two years Ahmed has been in



Bangladesh he has re-established his private English tuition business, trying to create a sense of normality. Ahmed wonders how long this place will be home. He longs to return to Myanmar, to have the chance to make a home once again in the land of his birth. Ahmed is adamant he will only return if the Rohingya are given citizenship, and have assurance of protection from indiscriminate attacks.

For now, that home doesn't exist. It is physically in reach,

but politically so far away. As I sit with Ahmed my prayer is that he comes to know the love and protection of God, and trusts in Him; that he has revelation that through Christ there is a place in eternity waiting for him and all Rohingya people.

Pray:

- that Ahmed recognizes what he remembers as home is only temporary and that the peace and security he longs for is only found in God, and that God has prepared a place for him.
- that political change happens and fair repatriation becomes reality.
- that the Rohingya will be recognized as true citizens of Myanmar.

New Things in the New Year by James Lima

I can't believe that I'm already past the half-way point in my seminary education. This January I traveled to the RTS campus in Orlando for my last set of required intensive courses. As always, it was a great week for me. We will keep you updated on the seminar as well as on all the other steps we go through in our path to discerning a specific call to church planting.

Skate Conference

We hosted a skate conference for German Christian Skaters. The goal was to encourage and train them to reach out to their local skate scenes and be the light of Jesus. God brought the whole thing together in two months, which was really exciting but also overwhelming. We partnered with Calvary Chapel in Siegen, a city in the west of Germany. They have an indoor skatepark and do skate ministry there. Most ministries struggle to attract people. But they attract loads of skaters, bikers, and scooters even though they do almost nothing with advertising. It was so full! Praise Jesus!

For our conference, they gave us the keys to the park and to an old building next to the park that was part of their Bible School. We had 22 skaters, including a handful from England and a guy from Barcelona.

We had seminars, worship and food! Amazingly, language wasn't a problem. Everyone bonded so well and was

so encouraged being able to grow together. We all went in not sure how it would go down; we all left with the feeling of "we're not alone" and that there are others out there who carry the same passion and heart for skate ministry.

One of the outcomes of the conference is a commitment to network. We have a list of Christian skaters for Germany from my work and now we are extending that to gather names and contacts of every Christian skater and ministry we can find across Europe.

If we can hash out this network, we can be more connected, work together more, and pray and encourage one another. Please pray for us to find ways to work together for the Lord. **German School**. I'm back in school. Wooh! A couple years back I did 4 months of language school. Since then I've spoken lots of German and grown in understanding loads. However my grammar has gotten worse. So I decided it was time to go back to

> school and figure out this grammar. It's been hard to be honest. The first day the teacher asked us to say a verb, any verb. I couldn't think of a verb. I couldn't even think of one in Eng-

Meaningful Relationships: How Can the Church Help?

Loneliness is a universal human experience, experienced by all of us at times. For others, loneliness is a constant companion which can signifi-

cantly impact their physical and mental health. One of the cures for this seems to be



found in making meaningful relationships. Although the church is an ideal place to carry this out, many of us flounder in our attempts to create meaningful connections with others.

Here are some thoughts that may help you reach out to others and overcome your natural hesitancy to do so:

- The development of meaningful relationships where every member carries a significant sense of belonging is central to what it means to be the church.
- What do you think makes a difference in people's lives?
- Small deeds are more powerful than great intentions.
- We drastically underestimate the influence we can be.
- We must introduce connection to the equation.
- We must ensure that we are current with the

people with whom we want to be current. We must remain patiently, locally, and personally engaged in the spaces, opportunities, and lives around us.

We must generate small wins.

- We must summon authentic concern for the ground level struggles of the people around us.
- You can live your life in a small area and have a big impact.
- People think there aren't frontiers anymore. They can't see that frontiers are all around us.
- What are some challenging, but potentially fruitful, relationships you need to engage or re-engage?
- What are the risks you can take this week to commit deeper to those around you?
- In T-Ball, attempts matterregardless of the outcome. Simple attempts matter because every action requires risk, faith, and courage and repeated practice will

help you grow.

- If our role is to love people, the small simple, everyday activities really do count! All of the little actions that build relationships count, and those are what we are responsible for. That's what God asks us to handle; He takes care of the rest.
- This relationship was built in a matter of seconds over time. It was the simple, intentional turning of my attention that made the difference.
- When we notice people, we assign worth to them as image bearers of the most high God.

As you read these statements, take time to think about a person or persons that could benefit from having you in their lives. Then with God's help be intentional about cultivating that relationship. You will not only help someone else, you will also become a less lonely person yourself. We were made to be in community and in communion with one another.
