Run with Endurance

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

Hebrews 12:1-2

Endurance is the word for this season. We don't know when this crisis and the accompanying social distancing, shelter in place, safer at home directives will be over. The changes which have been placed on us all have created stress, confusion, and bunch of emotions. We haven't traveled this way before, but we will get through it in a little while and become stronger in the process.

I have been a runner since I was a teenager. One of the things that you learn as a runner is that the more you check your watch for time and distance, the longer the run seems. It's always better to focus your attention on your breathing, your technique or most importantly on your goal. It makes the time seem to go faster and it helps you run better as well.

You may be tempted to check all

of the conditions and the news about the health crisis, but all your digging will not make it go away one bit faster. But if instead you follow the instructions of Hebrews 12, you will find that you will grow in spiritual strength and endurance while you wait for it to be over. The Lord endured the cross because he was looking

forward to the joy of being with his children forever. His wasn't looking at the pain but at the promise.



Let me encourage you today to take advantage of this surreal experience. Look at it as a gift from the Lord to weed out the non-essentials in your life. These are the things that get in the way of your daily vision of the Lord Jesus. Instead of being anxious about when things will go back to normal or worrying about if you will be infected with the virus, concern yourself with what the Lord wants to do in you this season. If you fix your eyes on him, I know that he will speak to your heart. Look at him instead of the stuff. When you keep your eyes on him, that's where true life, peace and satisfaction is found.

Thank you, Precious Savior that


- We are and will always be with Jesus and will see more and more of His glory



Germany to Sri Lanka and Back by Nathaniel Muench

When we flew to Sri Lanka on March 3rd, the virus hadn't gotten as big yet and there were still no reports of it in Sri Lanka, which meant I could eat rice and curry with my hands without getting sick.

We were 5 in total, John from New Zealand, Marlon and Andrea (who now live in Sri Lanka full time), Naomi and me.

The first week we spent traveling around the



coast, connecting with people and surfing. There is one small skate park (more of just a ramp) in the south and I talked a bit with the guys who built it and owned it. A couple days later I met with a friend that Zac worked with in Dubai who opened a hostel in the south. It was so encouraging hearing his story of how God led him and his wife there and the way He is continuing to use them.



After a few days there we headed to Arugam Bay. This is the village we stayed on the last trip to Sri Lanka. Marlon and Andrea had rented a house there that we would be fixing up and getting in order for ministry. We arrived on the 14th with the plan to stay a week.

The next morning we went to church and got a bite to eat and headed home. We got a phone call and then a knock at the door. The locals of the village had gathered the night before and told the people who we were renting the property from that we needed to leave because they thought we were bringing the virus to them since there was no other tourists there. They told us we could go to the hospital in Colombo (the capital city) about a 9-hour bus ride away and get a paper saving we didn't have the virus and then they would welcome this back. This wasn't much of an option though because Andrea was fighting a normal cold. But to keep good relations we needed to leave. Within the hour we were on a bus to another location 8 hours away in the central north.

We stayed there a night. Then the government shut down the area, so we headed south to a mountain village and stayed there a couple days.

Things started getting worse – the news said the United States borders were shut. The European Union shut theirs too. Propaganda was being blasted in the streets. People would cover their faces when we walked by. If you knew any Italians or South Koreans in the hotels or locals hostels you were required to turn them in to the police because the virus was in Italy and Korea.

We decided we would try and fly back to Germany and New Zealand before they shut down the airports, so we booked a flight for Friday the 20th. We took the long bus to Colombo Thursday the 19th and later that day the army came in and shut down the village and all the tourist went south.

We (John, Naomi and I) got to the airport only to find that all flights were canceled. There was no way out! We were praying and praying, not sure what to do. The airport was filling up with angry travelers.

We tried getting ahold of embassies and talking back and forth with parents. Germany was saying all Germans should return home. Things

were getting more and more heated. Naomi and I were able to get one



of the only 2 flights out that night back to Germany via the middle east. John was still stranded for 30 more hours before he flew out Saturday night to the United Kingdom. John said when he left they were planning on the airport shutting down and the country had gone into a mandatory quarantine. Marlon and Andrea went to the south to camp out with some Sri

God has been teaching me about freedom in Him. It's so it easy for me to become overwhelmed with the decisions I need to make here. What if I make the wrong decision? But God recently told me, "I'm pleased with you, and I trust you to make decisions." It's quite freeing to know that I can simply live life and make decisions knowing that He trusts me and will turn everything out for good. One of the things I need to trust Him for is my Spanish visa – which requires insurance. Over the past month I've visited the insurance office ten times (!), simply trying to purchase insurance. Finally I got through all the hoops – so now I am waiting for government approval.

The biggest decision I am facing is whether or not to cancel the upcoming Discipleship Training School that we've been planning for this April due to the coronavirus. I know that if God wants this school to happen, it will. Please be praying for wisdom over the decision we need to make.

gration, I had no problems at all. I made it. Praise God!

Now the state of Bavaria where I live has 2 weeks of quarantine. Thank you all for your prayers. I am praying for you.
