## World on Mission

In "World on Mission," I share a bit in each newsletter what I learned in the Perspectives on the World Christian Movement class – because God calls ALL of us to have a part in his mission. What is his mission?

"God is on mission to be loved, served and worshiped by people from all humanity." (Perspectives Study Guide - PSG, pg. 4)

In Genesis 12:1-3, God makes a promise to Abraham that is "both personal and immensely global: to bless all the families of the earth." This promise emphasized more of what God would do than what Abraham was expected to attempt. The outcome that God desired would impact ALL the world's people. This promise included land for Abraham's people, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky, and a blessing. The promise and blessing, went far beyond Abraham's lifetime and stretches to us today, the believers in Christ. (Source: Perspectives Study Guide, page 2)

In John Stott's article, "The Living God is a Missionary God," he sums up the fulfillment of the promise to Abraham:

**First,** He is the God of history: History is not a random flow of events, for God is working out in time a plan which he conceived in a past eternity and will consummate in a future eternity. In this historical process, Jesus Christ as the Seed of Abraham is the key figure. Let's rejoice that we are Christ's disciples, we are Abraham's descendants.

- **Second,** He is the God of the covenant: God is gracious enough to make promises, and he always keeps the promises he makes. He is a God of steadfast love and faithfulness. All God's promises come true, but they are inherited "through faith and patience (Hebrews 6:12).
- Third, He is the God of blessing: "I will bless you," He said to Abraham (Gen 12:2). "God...sent him (Jesus) to you first, to bless you," echoed Peter (Acts 3:26). His principal and characteristic work is to bless people with salvation.
- Fourth, He is the God of mercy: I have always derived much comfort from the statement of Revelation 7:9 that the company of the redeemed in heaven will be "a great multitude which no man could number." Although no biblical Christian can be a universalist (believing that all mankind will ultimately be saved) since Scripture teaches the awful reality and eternity of hell, a biblical Christian can – even must – assert that the redeemed will somehow be an international throng so immense

as to be countless. This is the fulfillment of God's promise!

Fifth, He is the God of mission: The nations are not gathered in automatically. If God has promised to bless "all the families of the earth," he has promised to do so "through Abraham's seed" (Gen 12:3, 22:18). Now we are Abraham's seed by faith, and the earth's families will be blessed <u>only</u> <u>if</u> we go to them with the gospel. That is God's plain promise.

So I leave you with the challenge to pray, asking God what your part is in bringing glory to him through this "plain purpose" that Stott mentions above – to bring all peoples to know Him. Read about the Grow Group (in this newsletter) on Saturday mornings that a few of us are facilitating, about how we can take simple steps in the Great Commission, bringing Jesus into people's lives.

Never cease to pray about your role in the Great Commission:

Matt 28:19-20a Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.

#### Cough by Barb Green, Parish Nurse

Coughing is something that affects everyone. It is a reflex that keeps your throat and airways clear. Although annoying, it helps your body heal or protect itself. Coughs can be acute, subacute or chronic depending on the length of time they last. Acute coughs begin rapidly and are usually due to a cold, flu or sinus infection. They typically go away after 3 weeks. Subacute coughs last 3-8 weeks; chronic coughs last longer than 8 weeks. Some coughs are dry while others are productive which means they bring up mucus.

Causes of chronic cough include:

- Chronic bronchitis
- Asthma
- Allergies
- COPD known as chronic obstructive disease
- GERD or gastroesophageal reflux disease
- Smoking or exposure to second hand smoke
- Throat disorders like croup in children
- Lung infections such as pneumonias or acute bronchitis
- Sinusitis & postnasal drip
- Lung cancer
- ACE inhibitors which are used to treat high blood pressure, heart failure or kidney diseases. Examples include lisinopril, enalapril, calapril & lotensin.

A simple way to ease a cough is to drink water or add it to the air with a steamy shower or vaporizer. Drinking plenty of fluids helps thin mucus and makes it easier to cough up.



Antihistamines may work better than non-prescription cough medicines if you have a cold or the flu. Children under 4 should not have cough medicine or cough drops. For those over 4 read the labels carefully and use caution. Over the counter medications which may help include guaifenesin which helps break up mucus. Many cough syrups contain this. Do not take more than the package recommends. Be sure to drink plenty of fluids when you take this medication. Decongestants help clear a runny nose and relieve postnasal drip. If you have high blood pressure check with your health care provider before taking a decongestant. Even though an over the counter cough medicine is labeled for children you should check with your pediatrician before giving. They likely do not work for children and can have serious side effects.

Those with allergies should stay indoors when airborne allergens are high. Keep windows closed and use an air conditioner. Fans that draw air in from outdoors will make a cough worse. Shower and change your clothes after being outside. Those with year-round allergies may want to cover pillows and mattresses with dust mite covers, use an air purifier and avoid pets with fur and other triggers.

Call 911 if you have shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, break out in hives or have a swollen face or throat with difficult swallowing. Contact your health care provider if a person with a cough has any of the following:

- Heart disease, swelling in the legs or a cough that gets worse when you lie down (signs of congestive heart failure)
- Is an infant younger than 3 months
- Cough that lasts longer than 10-14 days
- Cough that produces blood
- Fever
- High pitched sound when breathing in
- Yellow-green phlegm

Your health care provider may ask you when the cough began, what it sounds like, if there is a pattern to it, what makes it better or worse or what other symptoms you have.

Fall is approaching and that brings cold and flu season. To avoid these unpleasant diseases, remember to maintain a healthy lifestyle and get a flu shot. If you do get sick remember to use some of the tips in this article. Have a healthy fall! (Adapted from Medline Plus)
