June 19: Church is at Camp Wakonda, featuring the Koinonia singers, led by our missionary, Larry Schulz;

June 26: Featuring our church's partnership with the SDB Church in Uganda

Our God is a missionary God. He did not just look down from heaven and hope for the best for sinful humanity. He himself came down, lived among us, preached the gospel, and gave his life to save our lives. As

Pastor John Piper has said, "If you love the glory of God, you cannot be indifferent to missions." Let's join our hearts together during this missions month and see what great things God will do in our hearts and through our hands for God's glory!

- **Fruitfulness** Make their labor fruitful and let them be encouraged by seeing the fruit of their labor




Summer Sabbath School - 2021 by Pastor Liz Green

The 9 Arts of Spiritual Conversations

Jesus as well as his disciples, were intentional in engaging spiritual seekers and walking with them on the discipleship journey. Using Jesus' example, these 9 Arts open doors for drawing spiritual seekers to Christ.

You can think of the nine arts in groups of three:

Getting Ready: Noticing, Praying, Listening

Getting Started: Asking Questions, Loving, Welcoming **Keeping It Going**: Facilitating, **Serving Together**,* Sharing

We have the opportunity to be salt and light in this world

and serving with "not yet believers" is one way to do this. After all, God did save more of us



than just our mouths and serving together bridges the gap between what we profess and what we practice. People get tired of empty words and serving requires action. Serving together allows people to enter into a relational environment where they can belong so that they may see and feel the gospel being lived out. You experience life together and increase common ground. They get to see the difference that Jesus has made in your life.

How can we apply this in our everyday lives? We should look to Jesus as our example! Jesus Himself came not to be served, but to serve. When wine ran out at a wedding, Jesus asked the wedding servants to fill pots with water. He asked the Samaritan woman to give him a drink from the well, and told a lame

man to carry his mat. When Jesus fed the 5,000, He used food from a little boy and asked his disciples to distribute the food and then to

gather the leftovers. Jesus could have done all of this without man's involvement. Instead, Jesus asked others to serve with Him and through obedience, He responded to their faith in miraculous ways. An interesting question to consider is how might their acts of serving together have helped these people come to the right conclusion about who He was?

Anytime we serve, we should pray and rely on God's power and wisdom as to how we serve and who we invite to serve with us. It's easy to stay in our safe circle of Christian friends and activities, but God calls us to do so much more. You could identify a need in your community or neighborhood and then ask God to show you some Christians and people who believe differ-

ently to help you. After serving, you have the opportunity to ask them questions about their experience like did you learn anything about yourself or God today? Other opportunities to serve could be through taking up new hobbies, spending time with un-believing family members, loving your neighbors and getting to know your coworkers or children's parents. You could bring a meal to your lonely neighbor, call a friend you haven't seen in a long time, or drive someone to an appointment. Join Awana, serve at the GIFTS Men's shelter or the One Apple Lunch Bunch, or be a camp counselor!

Once you get to know the people God puts into your life, vou will have the opportunity to serve alongside them, talk to them about Jesus, and give them the opportunity to experience God's love. When we serve others, we are actually serving God, which is really our greatest honor. I guarantee that you will not always feel like serving joyfully! This is where we PT FROG (Personally Trust & Fully Rely On God), asking God to give us hearts to gladly serve Him and others.

Learn from the participants in the 9 Arts Grow Group

Some of the participants in the 9 Arts Grow Group last fall wrote about the impact of the class. Becky Snyder shares how various arts reflected on her relationship with children and her neighbors.

I've learned that praying for people doesn't have to be dramatic. It can be discrete and quiet. We can also simply show God's love by looking people in the eye, asking questions and really listening. We can show God's love by tuning into people's lives and show them they matter and we care. Christianity doesn't always have to be nerve wracking in order to make a difference in the kingdom.

We meet on zoom to grow


and learn and seek God's vision for the future. We're studying The Master Plan of Evangelism (Robert E. Coleman).
