Mawwiage!

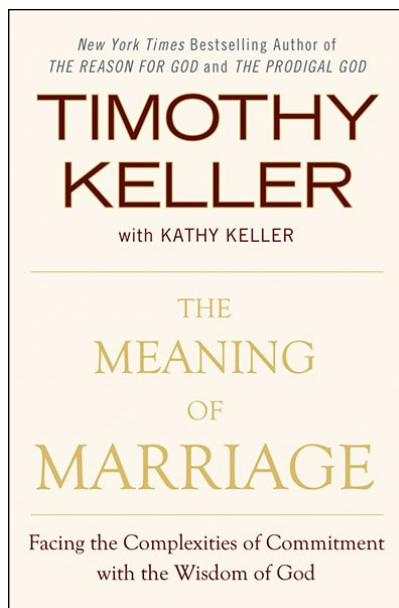

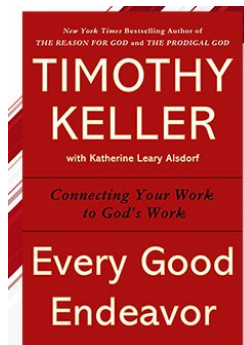
Why Do I Work? Sabbath School for the Fall Quarter

Taught by Elder Carl Greene

We work a lot of hours – maintaining our own home, raising our family, earning a paycheck, or volunteering, we invest a lot of time. But does your work have life giving purpose? It should.

There will be a Grow Group Class based on the book *Every Good Endeavor: Connecting Your Work to God's Work* by Timothy Keller. We will set out to answer three questions: "Why do we need to work in order to lead a fulfilled life? Why is [work] so often fruitless, pointless, and difficult? How can we overcome the difficulties and find satisfaction in our work through the gospel?"

Over the course of 4 sessions (September 4, 11, 25, and October 2), we will discuss each of these questions. We will read Keller's book individually and then come together as a group to talk about our take-aways, push backs, and thoughts in response. In the end, each of us will develop a Theology of Work statement that answers "Why do I work?" based on Scripture. Maybe even find some joy on the journey.

Participation Pages and Busy Bags are Back

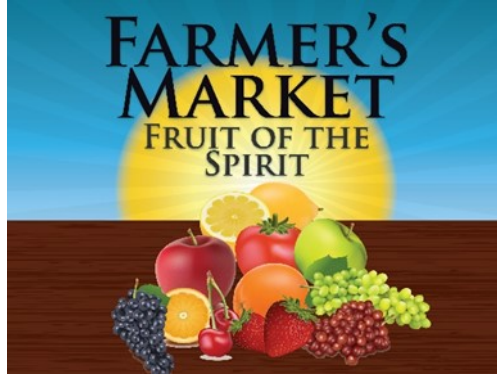

- 5.** That we would have the power to understand how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ. (Ephesians 3:17)
- 6.** That we would have the words to make known the Gospel. (Ephesians 6:19)
- 7.** That our love might abound more with knowledge. (Philippians 1:9)
- 8.** That God would open the door for the message of grace. (Colossians 4:3)
- 9.** That we would stand firm

- in the will of God. (Colossians 4:12)
- 10.** That the name of Jesus would be glorified in us. (1 Thessalonians 2:12)
- 11.** That the message of the Lord would spread rapidly because of our testimony. (2 Thessalonians 3:1)
- 12.** That we are so very, very thankful for the kids and other adults in our ministry. (Ephesians 1:16)

My Experience Volunteer at the GIFTS Shelter

Note: During our church's week to serve at GIFTS in April, Melissa and her husband Jere-my volunteered to serve dinner to the men.



I had been wanting to volunteer at GIFTS for several years so was excited for this opportunity to serve. This may be naive of me, but I anticipated an older, maybe dark, depressed atmosphere with residents who might be intimidating. I'm glad to report that this experience far exceeded my expectations! We were warmly welcomed by staff and residents as we entered the building. The building was bright, clean and organized. The night started with a tour given by Beau (Gilmore), a volunteer who clearly cares about the facility, residents and mission of GIFTS.

After the tour it was time to serve! The meal was basically ready, we just helped with a few odds and ends. I was amazed at the organization and love that went into the meal. All I have to say is the food was way better than anything I would have made for our dinner that night! Pam (Adams) prepared this meal as if she were preparing it for professional business men, demonstrating to us and the residents that these men matter and deserve to be treated with dignity and respect. The men were all

kind and thankful as we served them their meal.

After dishing out the food, we had the opportunity to eat with the residents. My husband and I sat at a table with five men. These men were just like us! Half of the time I didn't know if I was talking to a volunteer or a resident. I learned that any one of us could be in their position at any given time. The loss of a job, a divorce, a season of addiction after a death in my family and this could be me. I was surprised at how friendly the men were, almost as if they hadn't a care in the world. Laughter, reminiscing, joking. Maybe this was a time of respite from the harsh reality of life? I wondered how I would be if the roles were reversed and I was in the shelter? We found ourselves settling right in with the men. We were eating Mexican food and one of the men asked if we ever ate chicken tinga. None of us, even Pam, had ever heard of this meal! I told him I would be making this dish and I actually just got done eating it for supper to-night! If he is at the shelter when our church volunteers next, I will be excited to report I now have had tinga and it was delicious!

Several men reported the daily morning devotionals to be their favorite part of the day. One man was a Christian and one of the others said that he is not. It is great to know that GIFTS

is fulfilling God's command to go and make disciples of all nations! Yes, it's so important for bellies to be filled but souls are being served too! The men have responsibilities, which includes cleaning up after dinner. Honestly, I felt humbled that they were doing the dishes I ate on!

As we were packaging up the left overs, one of the residents offered to give us leftovers. This was another lesson I learned. Although he had such little worldly wealth, he was generous. I had to ask myself, how generous am I in my abundance? How do I define rich and poor? This night serving at GIFTS was amazing. I find that when I set out to help others, God usually reverses it in that I get more than I give. My eyes were opened and my heart was changed. I'm already looking forward to the next opportunity to serve and to see how God has worked in their hearts and lives since this first visit. I encourage you to take a risk, maybe get out of your comfort zone and receive the blessings of serving at GIFTS!

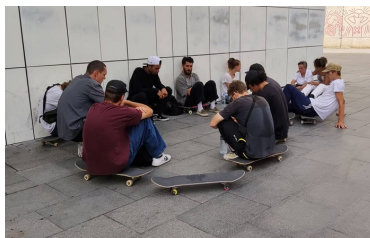
I got to spend extra time at home because 5 days before I was to return to Spain, they changed their Covid test requirements. But with prayer and patience, I got back to Barcelona.

July was back to Spain and Skate Outreach!

Barcelona Thrash: July 10 to 25th I facilitated a skate program focused on community and discipleship. Usually our programs are 5-6 months long. This shorter

program was aimed at students who couldn't get that much time off. We had 6 staff and 4 students –

a very diverse group: JP (Canada), Gustavo (Mexico), Mirjam (Denmark), David (Germany), Aquila (Hawaii), Ezra (Netherlands), Josh (Kentucky), Aaron (Honduras), David (Switzerland) and me.



Ezra had come to Thrash with an injury he got a few weeks prior. He mentioned how it was a bummer that his ankle was hurt because it hindered him from skating a lot. I offered to pray for his ankle and he consented. After prayer, his face lit up. He moved his ankle around and said "There's almost no pain!" He said if the pain was at 100% before, now it was only 30%! He was really encouraged because he'd only heard about people getting healed but now it was something personal. I think it was a sick way for God to reveal Himself to him.

As you can see from the pictures, it wasn't all skating! We had deep conversations, prayer and sharing of our stories and the gospel. We'll continue in the discipleship process with the students over the next year through video calls/voice chats.

David, Aaron, and Ezra all really want to do a full six month Calling All Skaters Discipleship Training School. At the moment there's no one willing to take on the role as a leader. Please pray for God to provide someone.

What's coming up: From September through December I will be helping coach students in their art practice and walk with God. It will be primarily online because of

the travel restrictions, with one week in person in November in Baltimore(!) and Barcelona. I'll be in the Barcelona group. We have 22 staff from 6 continents. It will be a multicultural art extravaganza of learning new skills and growing closer to God.
