From Surviving to Thriving

God's original design for human beings was to have life that was good, full, rich, satisfying, and, in a word, abundant. His good intention was quickly diverted when Adam and Eve thought that something else was better than God and his plan for their lives. Satan deceived them because he wanted to take from them the good life which God had so lovingly and intentionally given.

And so the life of abundance was reduced to a life of brokenness. The brokenness which began with Adam and Eve spread to every person, every human relationship, and every institution on earth. Instead of thriving, because of sin, life was reduced to merely surviving.

The apostle Paul described it as spiritual deadness. "As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient."

(Ephesians 2:1-2) Did you catch that? Paul says that they were physically alive but spiritually dead until they were introduced to Jesus. In other words, this is not the kind of life that God meant for us to live.

The Lord Jesus understood completely what the consequences of sin had done to the human race. This is why he came. He came to restore our lives to what God had originally intended them to be. This comes through so clearly in his words found in John 10:10. "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly."

The word that Jesus used for "abundantly" means not just enough to get by in life but "more than enough" or "superabundant." Unfortunately, even many believers in Jesus have not experienced the depths and heights of the abundant life in the Lord. They are still trying to survive and have not understood what it means to thrive in their life in Christ.

We want to change that reality, and the good news is that God wants it changed too! This month I will be doing a 4-part series entitled *Thrive*. My goal is to clearly show the path that Jesus has for us to leave behind the life of merely surviving and walk into the life he has for us that is thriving. I hope that you will join me on this journey, and even more than that, invite those in your life who need this message to join with us.

We give God glory when we share our thanks with Him and with each other. Let's fill the bulletin board to overflowing!

New Job

I applied for a barista job at a local cafe a few months ago. In the beginning of July I had my trial day, I guess they liked me and I got the job starting September 1. The first few weeks were a bit rough – not because the job was hard but because I needed to learn everything and speak in my second language. Most of the 25-30 year-old customers can speak English, but I need to speak German!

My first day working one of my coworkers said to me, "we know each other from YWAM." I didn't remember until he reminded me about an event there they hosted a few years back. Another of my coworkers is the wife of another friend. So crazy to make so many connections!

I work the morning shifts normally and I was heading in one morning not wanting to work, cold and tired and praying for the day as I cycled in. I got there and my friend who also was on the opening shift had worship music playing. A total God thing—such a simple way for God to change a rough morning into a good day.

Visitors

Zac and Sloan (another of the calling all skaters guys) came and visited Naomi and me for a week. It was fun having them around, talking about ministry, Jesus, coffee food and fellowship. We also got to

skate a lot and spend time with the local guys I skate with.



Local Connections

I've been able to go out with some locals and shoot photos which has been really fun. It's been such a good way connecting more personally with some of the fellas. The depth of conversations you get to have with people when it's just two of you out in the streets is pretty amazing. We are continuing our monthly skate ministry leadership meetings, our group is going strong and hungry for the Lord. The stories they share are always encouraging of what the Lord is doing.

6-Year Recap

Thank you so much for all your support! I just passed my 6 years anniversary since moving to Germany. I moved here with just \$800 to my name and a one-way plane ticket. God has been really good and I'm still shocked how 6 years have passed and I'm still here and He's still doing things.

When I first moved here, I knew no Christian skaters and now we have a network of Christian skateboarders across Germany.

Skate ministry was not happening outside of organized events and now our skate team is serving their local skate scenes and investing in local skaters.

We've created a European skate ministry network, beyond Germany, focused on connecting Christian skateboarders.

We've had some ideas that didn't work out, but God has continually been faithful and still produced fruit despite it all.

The amount of friendships, teams and people throughout Germany serving skateboarders in these years is unbelievable.

A New Way to Contribute to the Church through Stock Donations

The Milton SDB Trustees voted at their recent meeting to open a broker account in order to give our members and others a tax-efficient option of making stock donations to the church.

The following policy has been written in regard to the Church's acceptance of any stock or marketable securities. Please review this policy and contact the church office at 608-868-2741 if you are interested in a Charitable Donation Form. The form would need to be prepared by your own broker for action to be taken.

"Whereas neither the members of the Seventh Day Baptist Church of Milton WI Inc. board of trustees nor its senior staff are professional investment portfolio managers, it is the policy of this organization to liquidate stock immediately upon receipt.

The possible transaction cost of this sale is considered small compared to the risk of loss that can be experienced with delay in the sale of the stock.



This policy should be communicated to the potential donor of the stock to ensure the donor will not be surprised or offended at the immediate liquidation of the gift.

An investment account will be maintained with a minimum balance of cash or stock as required to facilitate the donation of stock to Seventh Day Baptist Church of Milton WI, Inc. and liquidation of the stock. The maintenance of this account to accommodate these transactions is the responsibility of the board of trustees.

A member of the board shall conduct an annual internal audit of Stock/Investment account transactions in collaboration with the treasurer to ensure accuracy of balances reported to the board. A summary report reflecting activities within the account and verifying the account balance should be provided with finical reports as necessary.

Proceeds from the sale of the stock are considered unrestricted contributed income unless the donor has imposed a restriction as a condition of the gift in which case procedures for accounting for restricted contributions will be followed."


