Hey! What's Your Story?

Lately, we've been emphasizing that a disciple is someone who knows, loves, serves and shares Jesus. Hopefully, this has gotten on your radar because if we are going to be obedient to the Lord and make disciples, first we have to know what a disciple is. The first three aspects of being a disciple are probably well understood by those who are in the habit of going to church. However, the final aspect, sharing Jesus, may need some clarification. Sharing Jesus is more than sharing the gospel. Certainly, the

gospel is something that disciples of Jesus need to share with each other and also with those who do not know Jesus. We can't make disciples if we're not sharing the gospel.

But what does it mean then to share Jesus? To answer that question let me tell a story. Our daughter, Julianna, went away to college this past fall, and along the way she found a boyfriend. I don't remember exactly how we found out about it, but what I do remember is the excitement that she had to tell us all about him. As parents, we were very interested to hear all about it for obvious reasons. There were questions

asked and stories related about how the relationship came about. There was wise (very wise) parental advice given and received (we hope) about relationships. How does this relate to sharing Jesus? When you have a story to tell, you just want to tell people about it. When our life intersects with Jesus, we have a story to tell. Sometimes the story is more about the day to day life experience with the Lord, and sometimes it's about amazing things that God has done. We can talk about what we are learning about

> Jesus through the Bible and our experience. We can share how the Lord has touched our heart through prayer or worship or the encouragement of a fellow believer. We can

tell about how the Lord has done something for us or to us that only he could have done. (Those are called miracles by the way.)

If you know Jesus and you have come to love and serve him, then you have a story to share. In fact, you probably have a million stories and you just don't know about it. In an effort to help us all become better at sharing our God stories, this spring we are going

2022 Church Goals

The following list of goals were developed by leaders in the different areas of ministry of our church. The were accepted by the congregation at the business meeting on January 23.

Leadership Development

In partnership with SDBU, train existing and emerging leaders in Biblical Interpretation, Practical Theology and Ministry, Discipling and Leading in the Church, Seventh Day Baptist Church Life and Public Witness, and Seventh Day Baptist distinctives modules.

Expand opportunities for Elders Carl and Nick to preach through multi-week series.

Youth Ministry

Continue to develop and deploy staff in leader-ship of Collision.

Meet with staff for inhouse training and growth 4x/year.

Identify and train new Collision Coordinator.

Lead youth to focus outward with the gospel.

Prayer Ministry

Follow up on providing a visible means of sharing prayer concerns at church.

Develop those who feel called to pray more into a rapid response team. Provide monthly single sheet handouts on world-wide prayer concerns from Operation World. Put in the bulletin and/or at Welcome Center.

Schedule corporate prayer opportunities, including praying at Camp Wakonda, praying at our schools, inviting others to join in regular prayer for our field workers, and a regular or semi-regular opportunity on Friday night. These may be announced or individual invitations.

Continue efforts to broaden our corporate prayer life beyond petition by providing prayer resources and teaching on prayer.

Recruit and train new leaders: Program Coordinator, Medical Director, and Camp Director.

Continue working on 5 year strategic plan.

Pursue having an SCSC ministry team to act as camp counselors.

Explore the continuation of a relationship with



Uganda SDB Conference and discover needs.

Children's Ministry

Continue to study the book Resilient – Child Discipleship and the Fearless Future of the Church. We will seek to help the children we serve **BECOME.**

BELIEVE.BELONG.

These goals reflect this discipleship model.

Provide ways for children to take up leadership roles in each of the 3 parts of our club night (Game, Small Group, Large Group). This could include, but is not limited to leading prayer, worship, helping others memorize scripture, being a team leader, etc.

Utilize the arrival time to have personal discussions about Jesus – the gospel message and how Jesus is working in their lives.

Build more opportunities to help kids feel like they BELONG here; specifically outside of the 6:25-8:00 club time.

Spiritual Growth

Diversify adult classes with more variety and varied presenters/ facilitators. Reimagine primary grade classes and possible alternate ways to meet the need.

Church Family

Hold one large group event in conjunction with Heritage Sabbath.

Find opportunities for 2-3 additional smaller group events throughout the year.

Hold one or more trivia nights for fellowship and fun.

Worship

Continue to invite new presenters to help with Sabbath morning worship.

Pilot monthly Friday Night Worship and Healing service for three months.

Increase special music presentations.

Invite outside speaker for Heritage Sabbath celebration.


And He has given us clear guidance to pray – and promises that our prayers will be effective:

It made me grateful that we have this ministry here in the area to be a place of comfort for young people to feel free from much of the expectations they feel from the world.

There have been many other times that discussion would come up as to 'why do you come to Koinonia Youth Group'? And like most kids they say they like getting together with friends. But the friends here are easier to be with. They are more accepting and not 'Judgey'!

And why is that? In many ways these kids are just like any other kid in the world and deal with the same imperfectness, but there is a special spirit here that is different. It is this: Matthew 18:20 ... For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them".

It makes me think: 'How many places in the world can you find this kind of atmosphere'? It's unlike any other the world has to offer. The world has many resources and doing helpful things, but there is nothing that can come close to the miraculous things that happen around the workings of Jesus Christ in the spirits of people.

That same night a young man happened to show up early and he and I got to talking about how we sense the presence of Jesus in our lives.

We both found it a bit hard to find the perfect words to describe the mysterious way it happens that Christ is working His presence personally, 'but He is'! The young man said it was a mysterious thing, but real.

What a blessing to get to be a part of seeing and hearing about the Lord's mysterious working in the lives of young people in the secret hard to explain places of a person's heart, but it is happening!
