So why does it seem that we so easily tend toward complaining about daily life instead of rejoicing over the victory that Jesus gave to us over sin and death?



Families! Families share a history. When they gather, families share stories - Stories about grandparents and people we miss. Funny stories about the children growing up. Silly, embarrassing stories about odd relatives. We tell them over and over again - these stories that help us know who we are.

As members of the church, the family of God, we've joined a family with an incredibly rich history. We know some of the family stories – Adam & Eve, Noah & the flood, the Tower of Babel, Abraham, Moses, David & Goliath.

Others stories – not so much – Nadab & Abihu? Joab?

Dinah? Absolom? Shimei?

Back in 2013 Pastor Nate challenged us to begin a "Bible Discovery" group. We started off in Acts and quickly "discovered" that we did not know the family stories (see Stephen's testimony in Acts 7). Without the Old Testament background, we lacked context. So in 2016 our small group

of 6 to 12 ladies, opened our Bibles to the very beginning – In the beginning, GOD...

For over 6 years we've met, plunging through genealogy, narrative, poetry, law, and even construction plans. After over 300 weekly studies, we've arrived at the end of King Solomon's reign. We've learned our family stories of faith and courage, failure and shame. Stories that show us who God is and what He is doing, stories connecting us with our heritage. Old Testament stories that bring us a richer understanding of Jesus.



This spring we've been asked to share some of what we've experienced. Did we really enjoy Leviticus? Can a group of ladies survive the death spiral cycles in Judges? What does

God mean when He says David is a man after his own heart?

Please join us for Sabbath School Sabbath mornings this spring to taste and see the goodness and truth of God through our family stories recorded in scripture.

Prayer Focus – Ukraine by Renee Sanford, Prayer Coordinator

Ukraine is about the size of Texas, but with twice as many people (44 million).

A bit of background has helped me pray: Ukraine is a major producer of Europe's wheat – it generated more than 25% of the entire Soviet Union's agricultural products. Since gaining its independence in 1991, Ukraine has struggled to take advantage of its economic potential and remains largely dependent on Russia for oil and gas.

Tensions with Russia and internally in Ukraine are nothing new. During the 71 years of Soviet rule, Ukraine endured famines deliberately created by Russia - over 8 million people died – almost one-fifth of the population. The Soviet government undermined Ukrainian culture, forbidding the study and use of the Ukrainian language. The nuclear meltdown at Chernobyl in 1986 continues to inflict environmental damage, disease, and death.

In 2013, the Ukrainian government sought improved relations with Russia. The

history of oppression led to massive protests with hundreds of thousands in attendance. When the government passed anti-protest laws, the protests escalated into deadly riots. Though these laws were later annulled, fighting and unrest continued across Ukraine, resulting in the loss of thousands of lives. In the midst of this internal chaos, Russia annexed part of Ukraine (Crimea), adding further frustration to an already divided nation. Attempts at peace and reconciliation have been largely unsuccessful – with the current invasion the latest escalation.

Pray for Basic Needs

- Meet daily needs for food, shelter, clothing, medical supplies
- Help families stay in touch
- Provide safe havens for refugees
- Strengthen the faith of believers encourage them and comfort their fears

Pray for an End to Conflict

 Let your peace and reconciliation overcome hatred, conflict, and war



- Address the historic oppression and conflict
- Show forth your glory as you control the destiny of nations
- Provide wisdom for world leaders in response to Russian aggression
- Change the hearts and minds of Russian leadership
- Open the eyes of invading Russian soldiers – draw them to you and to peace

Pray for Salvation

- Let followers of Jesus arise as messengers of hope to war victims and the oppressed
- Let the chaos and misery draw people to you – to faith and salvation in Christ
- Equip your church to minister to hurting people and disciple new believers

Ramadan starts on Sunday, April 2. It's the ninth month of the Islamic calendar and a time Muslims seek to grow spiritually and become closer to Allah and their loved ones. They do this by fasting and abstaining from pleasures like eating, smoking, drinking and intimacy between sunrise and sunset each day. Once the sun sets, there may be a feast or other social event. Observing Ramadan is one of the Five Pillars of Islam (the others being a profession that Allah is the one God, giving alms, praying five times a day, and a pilgrimage to Mecca).

During this holy season for Muslims, our e-mail prayer chain will include a daily prayer for the Rohingya from the worldwide prayer network "Pray for Rohingya." If you aren't on the prayer chain e-mail list, this would be a good time to join! Just contact the church office.

Q Place Groups Update by Jan Teat

Through your prayers and support, Christians are starting groups for spiritual seekers! Read what participants in my recent coaching groups said about their new Q Place groups.



Miguel works with international college students in Everett, WA, and started his new group in January after going through Q Place Coaching in the fall.

After 4 months of friendship building, in January we started a "Questions of Life" Group. Since most of our friends are pretty closed to religion and suspicious of the Bible, we are talking about questions like "What is the meaning of Life" or "Why is there suffering?" Four not-yet-Christian college students from Bangladesh, Costa Rica, and Japan are very committed, and five more from Russia, Pakistan, India, and Peru come occasionally. Everyone shares their own perspective and of course we share a Christian perspective, but in a gentle and loving way.

One guy from a Muslim background was very open to spiritual conversations and the Bible. So, we have started a Bible study in the gospel of Mark just for him. This is what he said, "<u>Today as I read about</u> <u>Jesus, I literally felt goose-</u> <u>bumps</u>." ~ Miguel, WA

I've been asking God to give me a bigger life, one with more influence, and He sure seems to be answering that prayer! In the fall 2020, I was leading a group of women through the 9 Arts of Spiritual Conversations when I was invited to Q Place Coaching. Coaching was so encouraging as the leaders shared many personal stories of how nonbelievers seemed to value having a space to discuss spiritual things, but I was resistant because after all, I didn't know any of my neighbors, I didn't have a co-facilitator, my workplace is an absolute nonstarter, etc. But God was working on my heart, and within a few months, He provided two other women excited to join my team. We prayed for our contacts throughout the summer, and just kept walking through the doors as He opened them. Our Q-Place group started on January 31st on Zoom, and we are all excited to create a safe space to watch God work in all of us. To Him be the glory! ~ Jill, MI

Jochen and Andreas, from a small village in Germany started their group in September. Ten men have been coming. They meet outside by a campfire with reindeer skins to keep warm! On Feb. 17th we got back together to check in and share how God has been working. Here's what they said:

Andreas: We are really enthusiastic about our men's group around the campfire. It is full of many interesting men. We always get something out of it and there is good and deep talking. I never would have the attitude towards leading a group like this if I didn't have the coaching. I have such a relaxed attitude and I don't have to teach or preach. I am just there, and we can be friends. It is so special.

Jochen: We love being there and it is so easy to invite men. When my dental patients share their problems, I ask, "Would you like to join us Wednesday evening?" Everyone is so enthusiastic. They like to come and want to come. Jesus has created a place where men can relax and have deep relationships and that's great. Andreas and I are still the biggest fans of Q Place. We're thankful that you helped us to establish the O Place.




