### Celebrating 25 Years of Reaching Kids for Christ in Milton

Where were you 25 years ago? Let me help you with the math. It was 1997. What has changed in your life? What has changed in our world? A little Google research may help jog your memory; that is if you were born before then. Bill Clinton was the US president, the movie Titanic was released, Tiger Woods became the youngest golfer to win the Masters at age 21. Beanie Babies were the hot collector's item, gas was \$1.23 a gallon, a stamp was 23 cents, and Princess Diana died in a car accident that year.

Another important event happened 25 years here at the Milton SDB Church. God had laid the importance of reaching children in the Milton area with the Good News of Jesus Christ on the heart of some of our church leaders. They began investigating and planning to bring an Awana Club to Milton. On Aug. 18, 1997, Awana International issued a charter to the Milton Seventh Day Baptist Church and our club began meeting under the leadership of Tanya Henry (McPherson), Cheri Appel, and many other church volunteers. Since that time, God has been using the Awana ministry with its dedicated leaders, church pastors and supportive congregation here to welcome well over 800 children on Wednesday nights. Each week during the school year, these children have had the opportunity to learn who Jesus is, how much he loves them and to grow in their walk with him.

In the world of children's ministry, we work alongside God, trusting in what he's doing in the hearts and mind of these young people. We know that a person's worldview is typically formed by the time they turn 13, so this opportunity we have to teach children about the love and sacrifice of Jesus is truly the most important time in a person's spiritual life. We are joyful laborers in God's kingdom. Yet, there are many times we don't know how God grows the seeds that have been planted once they leave our ministries. Milestones like 25 vears of service remind us to pause and look back at all God has done, offering praise and thanksgiving. He uses moments like these to encourage us to keep laboring and trusting the Lord of the Harvest.

That's exactly what we plan to do this Awana year. All year long we will spend some time remembering and giving praise and thanksgiving for all God has done, is doing now, and will do through the Awana ministry here in Milton. # Christ Our Hope in Life and Death by Pastor Nate

On July 2<sup>nd</sup> I had the opportunity to say a few words at the memorial service for our brother-in-Christ, Steve Gincer. Since it was held at the church he attended in Oak Creek, most of our church family did not have the opportunity to attend. I share these words with uou now in order to share in the blessing of Steve's constant focus on the gospel of Jesus Christ, which is what I will always hold dear from him. If there is something in these words that moves you, I would encourage you to follow Steve's example and to pass it on to someone who would benefit from it.

I first met Steve 15 years ago when my family moved to Milton and became part of the Seventh Day Baptist church. Over the years we connected on a deep level especially over the truth of the Bible, the issue of God as the creator of the world, and on books that he would pass over to me on many topics. But as I look back what was the constant theme almost all of our conversations was the gospel message.

Steve was always suggesting books to read about the gospel. He was concerned when the truth of the Bible was distorted by some teaching or trend. He handed out books like candy is handed out at a 4th of July parade. But he didn't just give books. He talked about the truth that God reveals in the Bible which the

books he was so passionate to give away spoke of.

Several years ago before Steve's brother, Mike, passed away I had the honor of sitting with them and talking about Jesus. Mike had recently come to the place where he truly understood the good news, the gospel of Jesus. It made all the difference in the world for him, so much that he asked me to share the gospel at his memorial service. Steve, even in his grief, was so passionate about what was going on in Mike. This is one of the powerful memories I will hold in my heart of the character of his heart.

Steve's passion was for people to hear the gospel and to know Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. He always came back to the gospel. It didn't matter who for Steve. If someone didn't know the gospel, then they should hear it. He started Salvation Singers just so that the people in retirement and assisted living homes could have the opportunity to hear about Jesus. He grabbed anyone from our church that he could to come along. If they didn't have musical talent they could just come and talk to people about the Lord. I used to play guitar. We would sing old hymns and old familiar tunes and everyone would sing along. The one song I was not all that familiar with was "Bicycle built for two", but everywhere we went all the residents knew that song. After singing, Steve

would tell people about Jesus. Those were fun times. It's always fun to tell someone about the greatest person they will ever meet who so passionately wants to be them.

Gospel means "good news." Yet for many people, the gospel doesn't really sound like good news. It sounds like average news, or perhaps even bad news. I'm convinced that when people don't view the gospel as good news it's because they think the gospel is about something to do or some group to belong to instead of a person to meet. The gospel is our introduction to Jesus, and it is good news because Jesus is the best thing that could ever happen to us.

I'll tell you why I think Jesus is the best thing that could ever happen to you. There is nothing in your life that can scare him away from you. Not one thing. There is nothing you could do or say that can come between him and you. The thing that you are afraid of telling people about because you think they will reject you, Jesus already knows about it and it is not so awful or bad that it could ever keep him away. His love for every one of us is greater than all of the bad news in our lives, including the bad news we contribute to this life. That is truly good news. How do I know this is true? I know it because Jesus never has turned away from me in spite of all the reasons I given

him to do so. I know it because Jesus has already experienced every bad thing we've done, and every horrible thing that has been done to us when he hung on the cross. I believe with all my heart what the Bible says about it. It says that he bore our shame and he carried our sorrows. In the most profound act a human being ever did, God in heaven took all the stuff that has broken our lives and he put it on Jesus. Jesus was broken with our brokenness, so that when

we trust him, he can make us whole.

Today we have to come to grips with the reality of death. Death says to all of us that we are broken, and there is nothing we can do to save ourselves from its eventual hold on us. But from the cross Jesus calls out to us and tells us that he has a solution for our brokenness. He is the solution. He says, "Come to me all of you who are weary and heavy laden, and I will give you rest."

Steve has gone to be with Jesus. But the truth is that Steve had already been with Jesus for many years. He walked with Jesus every day. This profound spiritual reality of personally knowing the God who loves us like we know our best friends, this is the good news the Lord wants us to hear. Jesus calls to every one of us. He is here. He is near. He is not far away in heaven. He is close by, and if you have not responded to his call, consider that today he is calling out to you.


