To you, LORD, our God, the lover of our souls, the alpha and the omega, we give our thanks for the fellowship of believers.



It is going to be a tough adjustment since we are moving from the city life into a town with no electricity, showers, clean water and other luxuries that I am used to. But It will be an awesome experience!

The Lord has also been growing in me a greater love for him through my fellowship with him through the Word and through prayer! He's been instilling in me the importance of my personal fellowship time with him, and it's awesome!


