Global Partnerships for the Gospel

I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. Philippians 1:3-6

Partnerships for the advance of the gospel are woven into the fabric of Christian history. Paul praised the partnership of the Philippian church with his apostolic church planting team. They provided both financial and personal support for Paul. They had embraced the team approach to being obedient to the Great Commission. On that Sabbath you will hear updates about our partnership with the Missionary Society in Uganda. We will share about our partnership with the worldwide community of believers who are sharing Christ with the Rohingya people group. In addition, you will learn how you can partner with our church people who are sharing the gos-



It's been three years since the Fellowship Hall has been filled with cheering race fans, wood-


en cars speeding down the track at speeds up to 175 mph and their owners, who carefully craft-
